
Easter Card



Material:

A stiff white paper (size 38 cm x 28 cm) A pair of scissors A pencil and a ruler Sketch pens Colours

Method: Fold the paper in half lengthwise and in half across as shown in figure 1. Draw triangles as shown with each side measuring 4 cm. Cut along the line AB. Creases and fold the triangles so that they sick upwards.

Cut two wing shapes - figure 2. Stick them to the positions marked X in figure 1.

Draw the rest of the cockerel's body as in figure 3. Colour it with beautiful colours. When you open and close the card, watch the cockerel's wings flap wishing a very Happy Easter.

A Basket for Easter Eggs

Material: A pair of scissors

A stiff coloured paper

A Shoe-lace or wool or any bright coloured Satin ribbon. A punching machine

Method: Cut out the stiff coloured paper in the pattern given. Fold at the dotted lines, so that the colour is on the outer side. With the help of a punching machine make holes towards the end as shown in the pattern.

Now thread lace or ribbon in and out of the holes. Don't forget the handle, joining up the end marked 1 to the basket piece marked 1 and the end marked 2 to the basket piece marked 2.

After threading right the basket, tie a bow to make it look attractive. You could also make some designs on the six sides of the basket to make it nice and colourful.

You can now use this basket to hold sweets, or Easter eggs or even a present for some one.
